





Introduction

Between the guitarist and the listener stands a formidable object—the guitar itself. A complex combination of wood, metal, glue and skilled craftsmanship. These days, the first three can be found in almost any guitar, but the fourth is found in only a few. Guild guitars have the critical four...plus some.

It's the fourth ingredient which separates Guild from most.

It's not available in bulk nor can it be patented—it is acquired by learning.

Each and every Guild guitar is hand made in the United States with the same care and patience as the first one was, back in 1952.

Any guitarist will notice the fine design of a Guild from the peg head down the neck across the fretboard to the bridge.

Look closely at the heel of the neck and you'll notice how it's cut from one block of wood, not a composition made from several.

This is to insure your Guild will last and last, providing a lifetime of superb playability. You'll know from the first inspection that your hand playing upon the Guild neck is really a continuance of what your Guild craftsman began at the factory; made by hand for the hand.

The body of a Guild represents a meticulous assembly of fine woods, like spruce, rosewood, ash, maple, and mahogany. The bracings, binding and bridge are joined together, providing a means for full round chords, clear, direct melodies, and bell quality harmonics.

Don't overlook the lingering overtones either, or the superb resonance.

To us, and to the tens of thousands of musicians who've purchased our instruments, the Guild name stands for a tradition of fine quality. So, whether you play for fans or friends, choose an instrument that reflects your dedication to music.

D-55

Guild's finest dreadnaught—displaying the understated elegance that marks the performing artist's personal guitar. Particular care is given to the aged rosewood from which the sides and back are made. Its tone spectrum is beautifully balanced, its natural projection remarkable.

Distinctive Features: Solid spruce top. Rosewood sides and back. 3-piece mahogany neck with fully adjustable truss rod. Bound ebony fingerboard with inlaid mother-of-pearl rectangular position blocks. Bound headplate with inlaid mother-of-pearl Guild motif. Gold plated Deluxe machines. Ebony bridge. Black pickguard. Finest 7-ply ivoroid binding. Delicate wood mosaic stripe inlaid into back. 20 frets. Neck joins the body at 14th fret.

One of the most popular of all professional dreadnaughts, known everywhere for its depth and natural power without harshness of tone. Here's a guitar that says "pure Guild", because it typifies the sound, materials, workmanship and finishing you'll find through the entire Guild line.

The D-46 is the first dreadnaught to use solid ash back, sides and neck in conjunction with a solid spruce top. Ash is noted for both its superior sound properties and exotic wood grains. This unique combination of raw materials makes the D-46 a truly vibrant and resonant guitar.

Distinctive Features: Solid spruce top. Solid ash back, sides and neck. Fully adjustable truss rod. Ebony fingerboard with inlaid mother-of-pearl position dots. Inlaid headplate. 

Selection of Woods

The aged, seasoned woods for tops, sides and back are selected for straight, quarter-sawn grain, with special attention to color and texture. Woods for sides and backs must also meet Guild's standards of hardness and stability. As the materials for each guitar are assembled, selection and re-selection is a continuing process.


Classic Soundhole

The classic rosette is a rich mosaic, expertly assembled by hand. The soundhole itself is of precisely correct diameter, accurately positioned to conform to classic guitar specifications.



Classic Bridge

Guild classic bridges are hand-made of rosewood or ebony, smoothly finished, fitted carefully with finest saddles. Close examination of a Guild reveals the many small but significant details that add up to total quality in an artist instrument.



Classic Neck and Fingerboard

Traditional classic guitar dimensions and proportions, as passed along from generation to generation of guitar makers. Necks are selected mahogany. Fingerboards are choice ebony or rosewood. Frets are finest nickel-silver.

Classic Tuning Machines

The Guild-designed tuning gears on all classic models meet every artist requirement of efficiency and dependability. Illustrated at left: Mark 5.

Inspection Before Shipment

Every Guild is inspected at least eight times before shipment from the factory. Each instrument is tuned to pitch, adjusted, then played as the final test.

Fully Adjustable Truss Rod in Neck

To strengthen the neck and insure straightness, all Guild flat-tops are built with an adjustable truss rod inside the full length of the neck. Because of the extra string tension all 12-string models are equipped with double truss rods. If adjustment is necessary, a removable rod cover on the headplate allows easy access with the Guild neck wrench.


Flat-Top Fingerboard
